nothing better for them than to be happy and enjoy themselves as long as they live; ¹³moreover, it is God's gift that all should eat and drink and take pleasure in all their toil.

I reflect on this verse at this time of year... and I begin to hum the song. And for me it is a great reminder that even as life changes...as there is a time for everything...that we are to enjoy our days...no matter what...rejoice in the present moments...remember the past, look forward to the future...and live right here and right now in God's kingdom. There is so very much for which to be grateful.

I challenge you to keep a little notepad of a blessing day...maybe you write this down with your family around breakfast or dinner table. Keep a list of your blessings each day...and on those days when you can't name one...reflect on all of the other blessings that have come before. Your heart will be filled yet again and receive the moments that the Holy Spirit grants us!

NOISY OFFERING: Serving in Malawi—The Ulrich Family

We knew there would be a lot of adjustments this first year, weather, unexpectedly, being one of them. Right now it is winter and the nights get down into the 50's, highs during the day are around 70 and many trees are losing their leaves. The children just got out of school for winter break, and we are adjusting to a new daily schedule for the next two months. Miriam is going to be moving to first grade. Pray for her as any change is a challenge for her, but academically she is making huge progress. Mark is moving to third grade and did very well in school and even got an award for "Best in Science" in his class.

We are plugging away with our language classes and continuing to serve the Lord wherever he leads us. He is answering your prayers and ours as the specifics of our longer term work here becomes evident.

Children Ministries

One of the places that we knew we would connect with is Senga Bay. We recently visited five different children's ministries there that have been started by other Global Teams partners. They started gathering a few local children in the community to teach them the Bible through worship, stories, games, memorization. and each ministry has over 100 kids. It is truly amazing to see how God has used these ministries to change the lives of the children, many of whom are Muslim. We asked if there was any resistance from the parents, but it seems that most parents are their children excited send to because they can see the positive change it makes in their kids' lives. One student testified that his parents felt that they had lost their son before he came into this ministry. After attending the gatherings and learning what the Bible says about how he should act, his lifestyle changed and they now feel they "have their son back."

Teaching

We continue to go to a orphanage on a weekly basis to do Bible teachings and activities them to show them the love of Christ and to teach them more about Jesus. We have also been very busy traveling around to many of the orphan care centers in the central region, assessing their needs, and seeing how we can help. We are in the process of coming up with a program for training orphanages to help the preschool teachers advance their lessons and to educate those that want to teach, but do not have the training. It is wonderful to know one more reason God had Jamie working preschool for the last eight years. We will also be teaching life skills to the older orphans enabling them to generate income when they finish their schooling.

We are in the process of helping the local Sunday school classes by expanding Malawian new а encouraging curriculum and continue teachers to children about the love of Jesus. So as you can see we have a lot of things we are working on and we are excited to be doing what the Lord is calling us to do.


